« The human image in Nielsen's paintings is little more than a fading silhouette, an intangible shadow, while the things that people build take on an uncanny vitality and presence, and both have a disjointed connection with the place where they occur. Nielsen has spoken of her admiration for artists who broach "the question of the fragments, the counterforms, the collagist aspect and the hybridity. Their works are both strong and fragile, full of decisions and doubts." She herself is one of those artists. In her work everything is strange, everything is familiar. We recognize our danger, but also our freedom. We glimpse the inhuman beauty of it all. »



Born in 1983, Eva Nielsen lives and works in Paris. A graduate of the Beaux-Arts de Paris, she is participating in the 16th edition of the Lyon Biennial (2022) as well as the 23rd prize of the Pernod Ricard Foundation. She is the winner of the LVMH Métiers d'Arts residence in 2021. Her work has been reviewed in Frieze, Artforum, Telerama, Art Press, Kunstbeeld, Le Monde, Art News and is part numerous public and private collections including the Mac/Val, Museum of Rochechouart, Beaux-arts of Paris, The Fiminco Fondation, MOCO (Los Angeles).

Eva Nielsen's work is constantly at the edge of something: at the threshold of the territory, of its center and its periphery, of the printed image and painting, of abstraction and figuration. From one horizon to one other, from format to subject, landscape predominates in her work.








Doline II 2023, 230 x 190 cm Oil, acrylic and silkscreen on canvas








Lucite (They)








Decaradian 2019, 200 x 170 cm Oil, acrylic and silkscreen on canvas




Hard Sun 2018, 200 x 155 cm Oil, acrylic and silkscreen on canvas








Chemical Milling 2021, 75 x 60 cm Acrylic, oil, ink, organza on leather LVMH residency production
